



MIGHTY MOUNTAIN LION

DESERT'S HIDDEN STREAMS

An arroyo is a special kind of stream channel that you can find in dry places like deserts. They're known for their steep walls and flat floors and can be really big – some are over 65 feet deep and 165 feet wide!

Arroyos weren't always like this. Long ago, they were just normal streams. But changes in the weather, like heavy rain, and activities like overgrazing by animals, made these streams wash away more and more soil, creating the deep arroyos we see today.

These changes aren't just interesting to look at; they affect the land around them. They can make it hard for farmers to grow crops and even change the homes of plants and animals. That's why scientists keep studying arroyos – to understand them better and protect our environment.
